Summary of Assistance for Dmax, Ltd. & GM and the City of Brookville

#### **Project Assumptions:**

- The primary focus of the Roadwork Development (629) Grant is to complete an eligible roadwork project in support of Dmax, Ltd.'s and General Motors LLC's (GM) project in your community.
- The total estimated eligible roadwork costs related to the project are \$3,895,920.
- GM's Project Details:
  - Project Site: Dmax and GM location at 101 West Campus Boulevard in the City of Brookville, Montgomery County.
  - Jobs Retained: Dmax will retain 814 existing jobs with an associated baseline payroll for the previous twelve-month period of \$51,900,000 exclusive of benefits.
  - o The state of Ohio is in competition with the state of Michigan for GM's proposed project.
