	Data from the 2020-2021 school year show the major impact that the pandemic has had on student learning in Ohio. The pandemic more significantly affected learning for Ohio's historically underserved students and decreases were more marked for students in districts that primarily used a remote or hybrid education delivery models. Similar to results nationwide, scores were notably lower in 2020-2021 than in past years, with significant impact shown across grade levels and content areas. The pandemic caused disruption to education, impacting student outcomes, and creating challenges for students transitioning from high school into postsecondary and careers.
PROJECT BACKGROUND:	The federal government allocated funds to support Ohio students through a variety of sources, as depicted in the dashboard on the Future Forward Ohio page. Future Forward Ohio encompasses the state's strategic priorities for using federal funds to help students recover from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, with a focus on students who experienced the greatest disruptions to learning. The priorities include: Overcoming Obstacles to Learning Accelerated Learning Preparing Students for Future Success
	Based on current data trends, in September 2024 many students will not yet have returned to pre-pandemic levels of academic proficiency and attendance, as well as other factors demonstrating student success. The convergence of declines in high school attendance and college enrollment suggests that for many pandemic-impacted students, are unable to see how school is preparing them for a career of choice. Providing students with an opportunity to earn meaningful credentials in high school is part of Ohio's strategy to support students.
PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:	While Ohio's students continue to graduate similar to pre-pandemic rates, high school attendance, and college enrollment patterns suggest students are looking for other pathways to careers, including those that offer meaningful employment opportunities directly after high school. One strategy Ohio has deployed to increase career preparation for students is enhancing the opportunity for students to earn in-demand credentials while in high school. DEW is exploring models for expediting the process for schools to develop and offer credential programs that create significant employment opportunities for students and has identified cybersecurity as the focus for this project due to the strong employment opportunities for students' immediately post high school.

SCOPE OF WORK

The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce seeks an experienced Offeror to identify 4-5 schools (one per region) across the state develop and offer cybersecurity credential programs. The goal is to increase the number of graduating high school students who are able to obtain meaningful careers in cybersecurity in addition to establishing schools that serve as regional models for other interested schools.

Prospective Offerors shall develop a program through which students earn industry-recognized credentials relevant to the cybersecurity career field. Programs shall also include real-world work experiences (possibly work-based learning) that are developed with local or regional business partners.

1. School Identification:

Prospective Offerors shall provide a plan to assist DEW to identify appropriate schools, this plan shall include the following:

- a. A process for identifying schools in each region based on location and job data.
- b. Communication plan for recruiting and onboarding prospective, identified schools.

2. Credentials, Curriculum, and Educator Identification:

Prospective Offerors shall include in their proposal a plan to communicate with school administration to facilitate conversations surrounding an implementation plan necessary for program success. These shall include identification of the following:

- a. Educators to participate in implementation
- b. Credentials to be earned by students
 - i. List of various credentials to be earned by students through the program
 - ii. Validation by local or regional employers
 - iii. Content instruction necessary prior to earning credentials
 - iv. Practical work experiences students may utilize while working towards earning credentials
- c. Physical space, technology (software), and/or equipment necessary.
- d. Industry partners to advise in the work and develop real-world work experiences for students.
 - i. Partner in the development of curriculum and experiences for students.
 - ii. Connect students to real-world experiences.

3. Train and Implement:

The selected Offeror shall train educators and execute an implementation plan which includes the following:

- a. Develop a comprehensive timeline with participating districts that involves facility, space, equipment, software, HR needs, training, and any other related components necessary to program implementation for the 2025-2026 school year.
 - i. Training and implementation plans shall include details on scalability and flexibility for future schools and districts to utilize.

4. Student Credentialing and Sustainability Plan:

Prospective Offerors shall include a plan to provide support to initially participating students and educators in credentialing programs in addition to a plan for sustainability which could be applied to other schools and districts. This plan shall include the following but not limited to items.

- a. Student recruitment
 - i. Recruitment timeline
- b. Curriculum implementation
